**DANIEL C. CHICK NAMED SENIOR LEGISLATIVE ADVOCATE  
FOR THE PERSONAL INSURANCE FEDERATION OF CALIFORNIA**

SACRAMENTO, CA – (June 9, 2003) Dan C. Dunmoyer, President, Personal Insurance Federation of California (PIFC), announced today that Dan C. Chick, former legislative policy analyst and consultant in the California State Senate has joined PIFC as Senior Legislative Advocate, effective immediately.

“Mr. Chick has a strong background in insurance policy analysis and has served as Policy Consultant and previously as Interim Policy Director of the Senate Republican Caucus since 1999,” Mr. Dunmoyer said.

Mr. Chick began his career in government as a Campaign Consultant for Bill Morrow’s State Assembly race in 1992. He served as Legislative Aid for the Assemblyman from 1992 through 1997. When Assemblyman Morrow won election to the Senate in 1997, Mr. Chick served as Senator Morrow’s Legislative Director and Press Liaison until 1999 when he became a Policy Consultant for the Senate Republican Caucus to the Insurance and Health and Human Services Committees. In that position he analyzed and made recommendations on legislation affecting all lines of personal and commercial insurance. He continued as consultant to the committees when he became Interim Policy Director for the Senate Republican Caucus in 2002.

“As the former consultant to the Insurance and Health and Human Services Committees, Mr. Chick brings a wealth of knowledge to PIFC to assist in analyzing key legislative and regulatory policy issues. His additional experience as manager of legislative floor activities and production of floor analysis will be invaluable in his new position as Senior Legislative Advocate,” Mr. Dunmoyer added.

PIFC Chairman of the Board, Dan Kinney, California Vice President-Operations for State Farm Insurance Companies, noted that Mr. Chick will be a strong link in PIFC’s efforts to work closely with the Legislature and the California Department of Insurance (CDI) to ensure positive outcomes for PIFC’s member companies and their policyholders. “The PIFC Board of Directors welcomes Mr. Chick to the team. He joins us at a crucial time in the 2003 Legislative Session. We look forward to his leadership as he joins the PIFC staff to work on the myriad personal lines insurance issues,” Mr. Kinney stated.
